

A ratification vote for the 2022 -23 QUAA Board of Directors was held through a confidential Zoom poll sent to voting members of Alumni Assembly. Quorum was met and the Board of Directors was endorsed.

Colin asked for a motion to ratify members of the QUAA Board of Directors. Moved by



planned to Calgary and Vancouver, and Karen has additional trips planned through the fall and into next year. She is excited to engage with members of the alumni community in -person once again.

Karen provided a high -level overview of SKLODQWKURS\UHVXOWVIRU 4XHHO past year. At close of Fiscal Year 2021-22, 4XHHQ V UDLVHG MXVW XQGHU 0 Cumulative result after two years was \$175.1M, which is 44% of the five-year target for philanthropy. She expressed sincere gratitude on behalf of faculty, staff, and students who, thanks to these gifts, will be able to move forward with important work and truly make a difference in the world.

Jackie Lewis asked if the final annual dinner hosted by Kim Sturgess which was planned for 2020 but cancelled due to the pandemic will be part of the upcoming Calgary trip. Karen advised that a resurgence of this dinner is not currently planned, but that she intends to bring this conversation up with Ms. Sturgess to see if there is interest in reconsidering for this year.

Lisa Hood DVNHG ZKDW)DOO ZLOO ORRN OLNH RQ FDPSXV IF confirmed that classes will be returning fully to in-person format. The university is committed to continuing with in -person learning going forward , within the government guidelines and direction to ensure a safe and healthy learning environment for all. Colin also mentioned that in-person ceremonies for Convocation are also returning in Fall 2022 , which is exciting to see.

George Jackson asked for an approximate breakdown of giving from FY 2021 -22 Karen advised that, of the \$64M raised, \$5 -6M was annual giving; less than \$3M were legacy gifts; and \$38M came from eight donations.

Bruce Miller asked about reunions being planned over multiple weekends rather than all being held over Homecoming weekend, and wondered whether this may detract from the traditional Homecoming experien ce for some classes. Karen advised that it is certainly an ongoing conversation and, while it is not unusual for some classes to choose different weekends outside of Homecomin g, this year is also quite unique. More alumni are anticipated to return to campu s than we might typically see due to the hold on in-person reunions over the past two years.

Alvin Hew asked if there are any plans for 4 X H H Q V O H DaceHtd Asks.LIS S K \ V L F D O W feasible Dwd Mace Weat for leaders to have at least a virtual presence in these regions. Karen advised that the Office of Advancement is currently looking at travel plans for Fall and Winter 2022, with a review of travel beyond that to follow.
