



The use of generative AI may support graduate research activities and innovations in scholarship across disciplines. Accordingly, the use of generative AI tools is permitted in the context of graduate research across stages of the research lifecycle (e.g., searching, designing, outlining, drafting, analyzing, writing, audio/visual content production, or editing) and will not be considered a departure from academic integrity under the following conditions:

- (a) *Authorized Use*: Graduate students, supervisors, and where appropriate committee members agree, in advance, on the use of any AI tools in the design, production, and representation of research or research creation activities. Students who plan to use generative AI tools in their research or writing of their thesis must, in advance, document approval for the planned uses of AI tools from their supervisor(s) and/or supervisory committee. In graduate coursework, the same principle of authorized use applies to the use of AI tools;

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
