

Understanding Kingston's Rental Market

- Kingston has a challenging rental market. You will need to use many resources, websites, and listing services to see all the properties available.
- Rental properties can range in price depending on: location, amenities included, quality, f nishes in the property, and type of property.
- Room rentals in Kingston can range from \$650–\$1,100+/month CAD with an average cost of \$850 CAD/month. If you plan to live on your own, one-bedroom apartments range from \$1,100–\$2,400+/month.
- Many landlords operate on a first-come, first-served basis. Being prepared, organized, and eficient is critical for securing accommodations.

Finding Housing Options

- Proximity to downtown Kingston and campus dramatically increases the cost of properties. Look for properties that are outside of Kingston's downtown or outside conventional student areas for accommodations at lower rental rates.
- Kingston public transit is a reliable, sustainable, and af ordable means of travel around the city. A bus pass providing unlimited access to the City transit system is included in the student fees for most programs.

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
