In addition, the federal government has been instrumental in the development of the region's natural resources, particularly oil and gas, through its participation in the Newfoundland and Labrador Offshore Petroleum Corporation (NLOPC). The NLOPC is a joint venture between the federal government and the provincial governments of Newfoundland and Labrador, and it is responsible for the exploration and development of oil and gas resources in the offshore waters of the region. The NLOPC has invested significant amounts of money in the region's infrastructure, including pipelines, refineries, and processing facilities, which have contributed to the growth of the region's economy.


