Proof of Personal Identification

Organizers will verify identification of all participants and compare it against their proof of vaccination. ~~The ID must include their:~~

Name

Date of birth

Examples of acceptable identification include:

- x birth certificate
- x driver's license
- x government (Ontario or other) issued identification card
- x passport
- x citizenship card
- x permanent resident (PR) card
- x Indian Status Card or Indigenous Membership Card

Physical Distancing

Capacity restrictions requiring two metre distancing are not required if the same protocols described above for events and meetings with food or drink are in place.

If dancing is permitted, capacity limit is 25 % indoors and 75% outdoors and masks must be worn at all times, indoors and outdoors, while dancing is permitted.

Masks

All participants are required to wear level 2 medical grade [masks](#) at all time except when actively eating or drinking.

If individuals arrive without a mask or forget to put their mask back on after eating or drinking, organizers have a process in place to remind them that masks are required, using [educative explanations](#). Organizers have extra masks available for those who do not have them.
